From the desk of the Parish Priest (updated)

We have now completed two weeks of Masses in St Mary Magdalene Church since being permitted to return to our Churches after the Coronavirus Lockdown. Many thanks to the volunteer stewards who are making this possible and sustainable. The 11am Mass last Sunday had 40 people (capacity 55) and the 6pm Mass had 30 people (capacity 55), and the weekday Masses are averaging around 30 people (capacity 55).

Mass at St Martha's in Little Common

Last Saturday, a team of volunteers gave St Martha's a deep clean and marked it for social distancing. This, however, reduces the capacity to 36 people and so we are looking to put on two Masses: *6pm Saturday evening and 9am on Sunday morning*. We have a confirmed team of volunteer stewards for the Sunday morning Mass and are nearly there with putting together a sustainable team for the Saturday evening but need one or two more volunteers to ensure its long-term viability. Even so, we will resume Masses in Little Common by celebrating the Feast Day of St Martha (*transferred from 29th July*) on 1st and 2nd August.

New Notice

Homeless Unity Group (H.U.G.): *The Bexhill Homeless Unity Group are having a summer fundraiser to prepare for a possible increase in Homelessness:* "The Bexhill & Rother Homeless Unity Group (HUG) today begins its summer funding appeal. Homelessness is an issue all year round not just in winter or at Christmas. The COVID-19 pandemic has exacerbated homelessness in our district as rough sleepers return to the streets following the end of government funding and families struggle with reduced income and unemployment. Since November 2018, our safe space at St Barnabas Church, Bexhill has had a positive impact on the homeless community by providing food, washing facilities and a social environment. This summer we are launching our settlement mentor programme to provide our guests with one-to-one support in gaining and then sustaining new accommodation. We also want to expand our small grants provision. We strongly believe that a small helping hand can make a big difference in alleviating the effects of homelessness. Since we began, we have funded Furniture and carpets for those moving into temporary accommodation, covering vet bills for the pets who provide companionship on the streets, repairing vehicles to allow individuals to be economically active and essential travel fares. HUG has also provided our guests with sleeping bags, dry clean clothes and transport for hospital appointments. However, with your help we could do so much more. The big charities are already using their superior marketing resources to canvass for donations. While we all stand together in the fight against homelessness, HUG can guarantee that 100% of resources are spent locally to alleviate hardship in our district. Our message currently is simple: support your community by giving local. HUG welcomes any level of donation and promises that it will be put to good use in the community". CAFOD in partnership with DEC: Millions of lives are at stake as coronavirus hits refugee camps and places suffering conflict. Every step we take now will prevent deaths and reduce suffering. For countries that have had years of conflict, people will struggle to access healthcare. Lockdown in these countries means that many people will suffer a huge loss in income, pushing people further into poverty and putting millions at risk of hunger and malnutrition. For refugees, such as the Rohingya refugees in Bangladesh, overcrowding and a lack of hygiene facilities in refugee camps means that the spread of the virus will be devastating. We have joined forces with the Disasters Emergency Committee (DEC) to scale up our response, ensuring that no one is beyond reach of the aid they need to survive. Our valuable experts on the ground understand the challenges and needs in their respective communities. They are able to respond quickly and are already involved in activities that include: delivering food to where it is needed most, improving hygiene, handwashing and sanitation at the community and household level. Producing radio messages, posters and leaflets in local languages on risks and prevention. Training community volunteers to carry out awareness campaigns.

Sacrament of the Sick & Pastoral Visits (updated)

For non-urgent visits:

Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion: Ministers of Communion may email stmm@btconnect.com or phone Fr Simon to discuss the individual situation before resuming any visits, so that he can also provide you with the up to date guidance. **Housebound:** It may be sometime until regular visits by the Team of Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion to the Housebound may resume. **By appointment**, the priests can make one off visits to those who need Confession, Anointing and Holy Communion at home, to those who genuinely cannot attend one of the restored parish Masses. Please contact Fr Rajesh on 01424 210 263 opt 2 or email stmm@btconnect.com and he will co-ordinate a visit.

Visits to Care, Residential and Nursing Homes:

You must firstly clear the visit with the Home before contacting us to arrange a visit. We will discuss with you / the home as to what is most appropriate.

NB: Except, in the case of extreme emergency, in many instances (and in all settings) it is good if a member of the family can be present at the visit, leaving the room if confession is required.

For urgent need (i.e. in danger of death):

“Last Rites” does not mean last minute! A visit from a priest should be requested in good time, if possible before the individual loses consciousness so that they may make a confession and receive Holy Communion. As soon as a person begins to be in danger of death because of illness, injury or old age, the time for the anointing has surely already come. If you leave it to the last minute, we may be away attending to other pastoral matters.

Visits to the DGH Eastbourne or the Conquest Hospital in Hastings: You must ring the Conquest Chaplaincy on 01424 757088 who are co-ordinating visits and emergency response for both hospitals (or if out of hours as the Ward to contact the on-call Catholic Chaplain). **For Bexhill Hospital**, check with them that a visit is possible and then contact Fr Rajesh who is co-ordinating the response from our parish.
