Preparing to go to Confession:

A Children's Examination of Conscience

- Do I say my prayers to God?
- Do I do what my parents ask of me?
- Do I listen to my teachers and try hard in school?
- Do I play nicely with my brothers and sisters?
- Have I excluded anyone from my group of friends?
 - Have I told any lies?
- Have I said cruel things about other children?
- Have I taken anything that doesn't belong to me?

Going to Reconciliation:

Priest: In the Name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. **Amen**

Let us place ourselves in God's presence, allowing Jesus to be in our hearts and on our lips so we might be honest with him about what we have done wrong.

You are invited to tell the Lord Jesus the things you have done wrong

The priest gives words of encouragement

The priest gives you a penance, one of the prayers below, to make up for our wrongdoing:

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name, thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven; give us this day our daily bread and forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. Amen

Hail Mary, full of grace, the Lord is with thee, blessed art thou among women, and blessed is the fruit of thy womb, Jesus. Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us sinners now and at the hour of our death. Amen.

Glory be to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit, as it was in the beginning, is now and ever shall be, world without end. Amen

Then the priest asks you to make the act of contrition prayer:

O my God, because you are so good, I am very sorry that I have sinned against you and with the help of your grace I will not sin again

The priest gives you absolution:

God the Father of mercies, through the death and resurrection of his son, has reconciled the world to himself and sent the Holy Spirit among us for the forgiveness of sins. Through the ministry of the Church, may God give you pardon and peace and I absolve you of your sins in the name of the Father + and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. Amen

 - Have I dishonoured the holy name of God or Jesus?
 - Do I watch or read material that is not appropriate?
 - Am I jealous of another's goods or abilities?
 - Have I told any lies, gossiped or hurt another person?
 - Have I taken anything that doesn't belong to me?

Going to Reconciliation:

Priest: In the Name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. Amen

Bless me, Father, for I have sinned, it is x weeks / months since my last confession.
