MESSAGE FROM DAVID FAREY

As lockdown eases many of us are looking forward to meeting safely with friends and family once again. In the past months, when so many events and activities have been cancelled or postponed, we are reminded that organised crime has not suffered in the same way. Scam merchants have adapted and so have traffickers. Methods of exploitation that were less lucrative in lockdown were changed, with those trapped by criminals moved like cattle into other fields of exploitation.

Criminals' resources make the fight against modern slavery intensely hard, especially for cash strapped and pressured agencies.

Members of our churches are embedded in the communities where slavery and exploitation is taking place and there is an increasing urgency for our churches and the people in all communities to be made aware that slavery and exploitation is happening **everywhere!** We can all learn the signs, using our eyes and ears to observe what is going on in our neighbourhood, taking action to inform the authorities when we see something that isn't right and giving them the details that enable them to act effectively. *See our item on becoming an Awareness Ambassador below.*

GATWICK IMMIGRATION REMOVAL CENTRES

Mary Barrett is a member of the diocesan Modern Slavery Abolition Group and a volunteer visitor at the Immigration Removal Centres based in Gatwick. Mary writes:

"I was aware that some of the men being held in Brook House and Tinsley House were victims of trafficking and modern slavery. I have heard their stories of being made to work in warehouses around Luton and Heathrow, of working on cannabis farms and many other stories of exploitation. However, I was not aware of these dire statistics: Between 2016 and 2019, 4,695 individuals were recognised as foreign modern slavery victims in the UK but of these, only 549 adults were granted discretionary leave to remain as trafficking victims."...

HOME SECRETARY, PRITI PATEL'S PLANS FOR THE IMMIGRATION SYSTEM - UNWORKABLE?

The current system for processing immigrants and asylum applications in this country is woefully inadequate with many people waiting years in limbo. However, it is generally agreed that Priti Patel's proposals for a new resettlement scheme for refugees, announced late last month, are unworkable at best.

The Joint Council for the Welfare of Immigrants said the 'New Plan' was "an attack on the principles enshrined in the Refugee Convention" arguing that they were inhuman and unworkable and do nothing to prevent the further exploitation of people by traffickers.

THE ARUNDEL AND BRIGHTON DIOCESAN STEERING GROUP ON MODERN SLAVERY

It is estimated that there are over 130,000 people involved in some sort of modern day slavery in this country. It can be as forced labour, domestic servitude, human trafficking for exploitation and crimes which enable trafficking. The task to overcome this evil is enormous and we seek to play our part in a number of ways.

1. To raise public awareness of Modern Slavery and its abolition.
2. To collaborate with other organisations and groups; networking with other churches and organisations across the Diocese to raise awareness and provide resources, like our 'safe house'.
3. To assist the Police in bringing to justice the perpetrators Modern Slavery by raising awareness and showing people how to play their part in tracking down criminals.

Our meetings regularly have input from the police and other organisations as necessary.

We hope to form a network of individuals and groups across our Diocese. Working together we can raise awareness, encouraging people to be vigilant and giving them the tools they need to report suspicious activity. Providing individuals and groups with the latest information means they can be active in every way to eradicate this affront to human dignity.

Our remit includes lobbying, where appropriate, for rigorous application of government legislation, holding companies and organisations accountable for their supply chains and hidden sources of exploitation.
