St George, Martyr (Patron of England)

(Transferred to 24th April)

Due to 23rd April being a Sunday, the celebration of the Resurrection takes precedence over Saint George, whose feast day is celebrated the next day. With St George, history and legend get confused. We believe he was born in Lydda, Palestine and was a successful and popular Roman soldier. In AD 302, the emperor Diocletian issued an edict that every Christian soldier should be arrested and that all soldiers should make sacrifice to the roman 'gods'. George protested to the emperor, who then tried to buy his silence. Instead, George himself proclaimed his own faith in Jesus Christ. To maintain his authority Diocletian had George tortured and executed. What about St George and the Dragon? This idea was brought back by the crusaders and is, perhaps, best left to legend than truth. As Christians, we see the image of the dragon as any attitude opposed to gospel truth, opposed to Christ and his Church. Shakespeare's depiction (*Henry V, Act III*) of the rallying call of the King to the troops about to storm the breach at Harfleur, perhaps, should be seen, today, as a reminder of our hope that good will triumph over evil, rather than a call to physical battle. Indeed, as a soldier, George recognizes, *'victory and power and empire have been won by our God, and all authority for his Christ'*. As a martyr, he rejoices in Christ's resurrection, for the dragon Christ vanquished on the cross, the devil, sin, and death. George himself would happily defer his celebration by a day, lovingly giving way to the 3rd Sunday of the Resurrection. Fr Simon.
