It is best to read the whole plan, but some pertinent paragraphs will be shared in the newsletter.

3.1iv: The Eucharist, celebrated with care and with active participation, is the most profound encounter with Christ and is the greatest prayer that we can offer. 2.3: Future provision will not be the same as it has been in recent decades, but this must not keep us from the celebration. 2.4: Just as priests will travel to celebrate with the communities they serve, so some travel may well be required of the lay faithful also. The act of joining in the celebration of the Eucharist must take priority over attempts to preserve an existing community. 2.5: Services of Word & Communion are for use in emergencies, such services are not designed for regular use and must not be seen simply as a replacement for Sunday or weekday Mass.

Peace Sunday 2024: Artificial Intelligence and Peace

Pope Francis invites us to consider how Artificial Intelligence impacts on our freedom, peace, and security. We ask, *'who is gaining power through the use of AI and who is being disempowered? What is the impact on human ethics, is it making us better people or manipulating us to accept ideologies incompatible with the gospel?'* The boundary between truth and opinion has become blurred, as if truth and falsehood are merely about personal taste. Whereas the truth remains the truth even if no-one wishes to believe it, and falsehood remains false even if everyone claims it to be true! In our time, it has never been more important for us to know our scriptures and catechism so that we may know the truth and not some warped version of *'my truth'*. Maybe, we should be concerned about people who live life through their screens, never *'unplugging.'* We gather as the *'Ecclesia'*, the people of God, coming to the Church to encounter *'the Word who is Life'*. As Bishop Richard says in the Pastoral Plan, *'while the use of livestreaming has been a blessing during the Covid Pandemic – and will continue to be for those unable to join their brothers and sisters through ill health – this cannot replace full and active participation in the Eucharist (p. 2:2).'* Called to Mission, we continue the work of the Apostles to gather the nations into the peace of God's Kingdom. *'Ite Missa Est: Go, you are sent'* to our families, inviting them to *'Come and See'* a glimpse of the heavenly peace found in the Mass. The Church reiterates the question of Jesus to the disciples: *'what do you want?'* [perhaps a better translation, *'what are you searching for?'*] They seek the one who brings meaning to their life. A disciple follows a discipline, there being no greater one than the way of the cross: *'If you want to be a disciple of mine'*, says the Lord, *'you must renounce yourself and pick up your cross daily, and follow me'*. God bless. Fr Simon.
