The Lord upholds my life.

In the Gospel today Jesus says, "If anyone wants to be first, he must make himself last of all and servant of all". When we serve others, we receive something that money can never buy.

St Teresa of Calcutta said this:

'When He was dying on the Cross, Jesus said, "I thirst." Jesus is thirsting for our love, and this is the thirst of everyone, poor and rich alike. We all thirst for the love of others, that they go out of their way to avoid harming us and to do good to us. This is the meaning of true love, to give until it hurts. This neglect to love brings spiritual poverty. Maybe in our own family we have somebody who is feeling lonely, who is feeling sick, who is feeling worried. Are we there? Are we willing to give until it hurts in order to be with our families, or do we put our own interests first? We must remember that love begins at home, we must also remember that 'the future of humanity passes through the family.'

'One evening we went out and we picked up four people from the street. And one of them was in a most terrible condition. I told the sisters: "You take care of the other three; I will take care of the one who looks worse." So, I did for her all that my love can do. I put her in bed, and there was such a beautiful smile on her face. She took hold of my hand, as she said one word only: "Thank you" - and she died. I could not help but examine my conscience before her. And I asked: "What would I say if I were in her place?" And my answer was very simple. I would have tried to draw a little attention to myself. I would have said: "I am hungry, I am dying, I am cold, I am in pain," or something. But she gave me much more, she gave me her grateful love. And she died with a smile on her face'.

Fr Simon does not sign SIF forms of non-Catholic Children.***
