Second 'Transfiguration' Sunday of Lent, C

The Lord is my light and my salvation.

It is probably inevitable that we can be often surprised by where God leads us. After all, it's logical to think that God might think differently from us, or as Isaiah 55:8 puts it: "My thoughts are not your thoughts; my ways not your ways". However, God understands that this is difficult for us. We could think of St John Henry Newman. When he was an Oxford undergraduate, feeling called to ministry in the Church of England, he was probably surprised already that he was drawn towards making the Anglican tradition closer to Catholic belief, in the Oxford Movement. When he visited Italy, and felt the call to "cross the Tiber" and acknowledge that the Catholic Church was his true home, and moreover when he realised that most of his friends would desert him because of this, he must have found it very challenging to follow God's will, but, with the Holy Spirit with him, he managed it.

Today's readings give us examples of just this sense of God taking us in an unexpected direction. Abram (note his original name, before the covenant with God- even my autocorrect finds that difficult!) could scarcely believe that he and Sarah are, far from not being able to have a child, are going to be the founders of God's people. The disciples could scarcely believe the miracle they would see in the Transfiguration- and we know that Peter will find so much difficulty throughout Jesus' journey to the Cross and Resurrection. This miracle would be part of his growing understanding.

Today we are faced, not with a radical different course, or a new discovery, but a world in which we are facing an increasingly difficult climate in which to live our faith. We are being called to a different model of our local Church.

To this end, all of our communities in coastal East Sussex are being called to become one parish. This does not mean that everything will be centralised- in fact far from it: the vision of Bishop Richard is that we will encourage each of our communities to do as much locally as is possible and permissible in Church law. However, it does mean a new vision. The clergy will work as a team to serve the new parish and our local hubs. We are also all called to live our common baptismal vocation. Whether ordained or not, each of us is called to minister as priests, prophets and queens or kings. Let's all think and pray about how we can serve our local communities, the church in Bexhill and Little Common, and the community across coastal East Sussex. God is calling us to live the Gospel in a new way- let's proclaim the Good News to everyone as part of this call.
